### 2 Saturday ~ Arab World Media

We are just over halfway through the year, so it is time to look back over the last six months and praise God for his incredible work across the Arab world.

#### 3 Sunday ~ Arab World Media

From the 1st of January to the 30th of June, we have seen 212 Arab seekers profess faith in Jesus through our online ministry, and 23 have taken the next step and been baptized! The team of online responders have spoken to over 8,000 individuals and is doing an incredible job answering tricky questions and supporting seekers on their journey to faith.

### 4 Monday ~ Arab World Media

We have 95 individuals participating in online discipleship groups, and 104 seekers have chosen to meet with local believers in their context face-to-face. Plus, Arabs seeking truth downloaded over 5,900 digital Bibles, so we especially pray that God's word will penetrate the hearts of those reading and that they will feel led to reach out to us for conversation and discipleship.

### 5 Tuesday ~ Pioneers 1

A Pioneer in the Middle East asked a local believer: If you knew 100 people would pray for you, what would you ask them to pray? Let's pray as she asked: That her faith would grow and she wouldn't be afraid to live it out and answer questions others ask.

### 6 Wednesday ~ Pioneers 2

Pioneers in Central Asia have been praying for teammates for three years. Now another family is preparing to join them. Praise the Lord!

#### 7 Thursday ~ Pioneers 3

Each year, churches in SE Asia hold a national Bible camp for kids. Some 800 came to the recent camp. Pray that these children will become men and women who love the Lord and desire to serve Him faithfully all their lives.

### 8 Friday ~ Pioneers 4

Lift up a new Pioneer preparing to move to Asia in 2 mos. His church will commission him this week. Most of his support is in. But he knows the important thing is growing intimacy with the Lord and trust in His perfect timing.

A single woman serving in Africa is preparing to retire after serving there for decades. She's wrapping up projects and handing off responsibilities before taking her last few months for goodbyes. Pray she would finish well.
