³ For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures,



⁴ that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, ⁵ and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve.



⁶ Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep.



⁷Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. ⁸ Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me.



¹² Now if Christ is proclaimed as raised from the dead, how can some of you say that there is no resurrection of the dead?



¹³ But if there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised. ¹⁴ And if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain.



³² If the dead are not raised, "Let us eat and drink, for tomorrow we die."



³⁵ But someone will ask, "How are the dead raised? With what kind of body do they come?"



⁴² What is sown is perishable; what is raised is imperishable. ⁴³ It is sown in dishonor; it is raised in glory. It is sown in weakness; it is raised in power.



44 It is sown a natural body; it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual body.



45 Thus it is written,

"The first man Adam became a living being";
the last Adam became a life-giving spirit.



⁴⁷ The first man was from the earth, a man of dust; the second man is from heaven.



48 As was the man of dust, so also are those who are of the dust, and as is the man of heaven, so also are those who are of heaven.



⁴⁹ Just as we have borne the image of the man of dust, we shall also bear the image of the man of heaven.



but we shall all be changed, ⁵² in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet.



For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we shall be changed. ⁵³ For this perishable body must put on the imperishable, and this mortal body must put on immortality.
